#### Lead & Copper Monitoring Requirements

#### Not Met for Turlock Auction Yard, Inc Water System for 1<sup>st</sup> Initial 6-month (July-December) 2025 Monitoring Period

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did to correct the situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. Between July and December of 2025, we did not meet the initial monitoring requirements for Lead and Copper and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

#### What should I do?

- **You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective actions.**
- The table below lists the contaminant we did not properly test between July - December 2025 and how many samples we are required to take and how often, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples will be taken.

Contaminant	Required sampling frequency	Number of samples taken	When all samples should have been taken	When samples will be taken
Lead & Copper	2 Initial rounds 6-months apart. 5 Samples in each round.	0	July and December 2025	Between January and June 2026

- If you have health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? What is being done? The Lead & Copper sampling required by DDW last year was not collected. The first samples have since been collected and we are currently awaiting results. Once those results have come through, they will be properly uploaded and submitted per DDW guidelines.

Description of corrective action: The corrective action is to become current with all sampling requirements and ensure that all sample dates moving forward are met.

We anticipate resolving the problem within the estimated time frame: The initial round of sampling has been completed and we expect results no later than March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2026.

## **Secondary Notification Requirements**

Upon receipt of notification from a person operating a public water system, the following notification must be given within 10 days [Health and Safety Code Section 116450(g)]:

- SCHOOLS: Must notify school employees, students, and parents (if the students are minors).
- RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY MANAGERS OR MANAGERS (including nursing homes and care facilities): Must notify tenants.
- BUSINESS PROPERTY MANAGERS, MANAGERS, OR OPERATORS: Must notify employees of businesses located on the property.

**Disclosure:** Be advised that the California Health and Safety Code sections 116725 and 116730 state that any person who knowingly makes any false statement on any report or document submitted for the purpose of compliance with the Safe Drinking Water Act may be liable for a civil penalty not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for each separate violation or, for continuing violations, for each day that violation continues, or may be charged with a misdemeanor, punishable with a fine of up to \$25,000 for each day of violation, or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed one year, or by both the fine and imprisonment.
